

## **Ecojustice online comment moderation policy**

Comments are a great way to share information and sustain a dialogue on important environmental issues. We invite you to join the conversation.

When posting a comment on Ecojustice's website or social media channels, please be respectful and follow the guidelines below:

1. No racist, xenophobic, sexist, homophobic or otherwise discriminatory or hateful language.
2. No threatening language or comments advocating violence.
3. Keep it family friendly. No obscene, graphic or profane language.
4. Avoid partisan comments. Ecojustice is a registered charity, which means that while we can advocate for or against specific policy positions, we cannot advocate for or against particular political parties or politicians. When commenting on our website or via our social media channels, refrain from editorializing about politicians or political parties. Also, please refrain from offering advice on who other readers should or should not vote for.
5. No personal attacks. Voice a criticism or share a contrary opinion, but don't attack authors, other commenters or the subject of a story as people. Don't make accusations you cannot support and be sure to respect the privacy of others.
6. No spam. Don't use the comment function to post ads or commercial content. Be brief and refrain from posting the same comment multiple times and from taking the discussion off topic.

Failure to follow these guidelines will result in comments being deleted. In extreme or repeat cases, accounts may be blocked, preventing further participation in Ecojustice's online community.
